# Why Apprenticeships?



An apprenticeship, which is for a minimum of 12 months, combines hands-on work with the opportunity to train and obtain qualifications.

## **Training**

At least 20% of your time is set aside for learning, usually at a college, university or training provider.

You will gain qualifications such as NVQ, BTEC or even Degrees

## Pay

As an apprentice, you'll earn a wage.

The current minimum rate for an apprentice is £5.28 per hour (Apr23). This rate applies if you're under 19, or if you're aged 19 or over and are in your first year. Beyond this you must be paid the national minimum wage
